

Requirements for Degrees

Associate of Theology – 60 Semester Hours

This associate degree program is designed so that the layperson may build a progressive academic program balanced in content and ministry application.

Bachelor of Theology – 120 Semester Hours

It is a degree program focused on the Word of God, with an emphasis in Biblical doctrine and theology.

Bachelor of Religious Education – 120 Hours

The Bachelor of religious Education degree program is a course of study designed for individuals desiring to enter, or are already in a leadership role of the Bible-centered ministry.

Master of Religious Education – 45 Semester Hours

The Master of Religious Education degree is a graduate level professional degree for those seeking to serve in an educational ministry in a Church or related agency, or institution. This course of study seeks to maximize the students' level of competency in a Church related educational ministry. Students who progress through the program will grow in their ability to formulate a Biblical philosophy of education, to understand the basic principles of teaching and learning situations, and to develop the specific competencies which are necessary for teaching, organizing, and administering programs, and for effective leadership in a variety of situations.

Master of Divinity – 90 Semester Hours The master of Divinity Program is designed primarily for those who expect to enter the formal ministry; either the pastorate or an organization associated with the work of the local Church, individual Christians, and the sharing of the Gospel with all people in accord with the Biblical mandate. A strong interest in the total implication of the Gospel for society pervades the program.

Doctor of Ministry – The quality and success of the Christian Ministry are very often determined by the Ministers' ability to communicate in oral and written fashion. It is the purpose of the DOCTOR OF MINISTRY PROGRAM to enhance the spiritual gifts and abilities of Christian leaders presently serving in the Ministry. Through developing their writing, speaking, and administrative skills, Delaware Theological Seminary seeks to train Ministers for effective leadership.

The DOCTOR OF MINISTRY is a professional degree designed for those engaged in the Pastoral Ministry or other areas of Christian service. Those seeking admission to the DOCTOR OF MINISTRY PROGRAM would have completed the M. Div. or its equivalent. They will be able to use the linguistic, critical, and exegetical tools requisite for interpreting the Scriptures.

To earn the DOCTOR OF MINISTRY DEGREE, the student must complete 36 credit hours beyond the Masters' level, including a Doctoral Dissertation.

Admission Information

ADMISSION POLICIES

Application for admission to Delaware Theological seminary will be considered without regard to race, religious affiliation, color, national or ethnic origin. The seminary seeks for students who are committed to Christ, and whose lives demonstrate consistency with the teachings of the Bible. It is expected that such students will be emotionally, as well as, spiritually suited for Christian service, and intellectually capable of rigorous academic discipline. The prospective student is assessed according to his/her academic background and personal testimony for the Lord Jesus Christ. In considering applications, the Admission Committee reviews the prospective students' complete record, recommendations, and personal information. If the student meets the required standard, he/she is admitted to DTS and remains until he/she completes his/her program or becomes inactive.

Students who are admitted are expected to abide by the rules and regulations set forth by the Seminary, and adhere to the "STANDARDS OF CONDUCT."

Applications must be made on the Official Form, furnished by the Office of Admissions. When the necessary information and fees have been received, action will be taken on the application by the Admission Committee

Grades, Grade Point, and Grade Point Average

1. For a student to receive a grade or credit for a course, his/her name must appear on the official class roster provided by the REGISTRAR'S OFFICE.

2. Instructors will verify their official class roster during the first few weeks of a semester A student, who remains on an official class
